Our programmes and projects are more streamlined and targeted now.

The following programmes are operational in the organisation.

Sustainable livelihood (S/L): We were successful with our funding application with DSD. We managed to secure funding for 2024-2025. Currently we serve up to 200 cooked meals a day. The kitchen is managed by, Patricia, Elvira and Devora, and other support volunteers.

<u>Learners Support Programme (LSP):</u> This programme is in its second year. The team of volunteers dedicated each Saturday for about 3 hours, to assist learners that has challenges with reading. They have introduced a diverse programme, with skills, games, teambuilding and a spelling bee competition. The team consist of mr Chleo, Kim, Zeldine and Shirley.

Maths Kidz{Mkz): This is a new programme, that we launched on 4 th February 2024. The maths tutor, is mr Chleo Conjana, who is a 4th year student in education. To date he has done a phenomenal job, by introducing learners to computers, online and manual work. He is supported by an amazing admin team, Zeldine, Jamie-Lee and Shirley. The funding was provided by the Taku Family, and streamlined to us by Bold Moves Africa.

The Skills Room(TSR): This space offers various training, with the main focus on Computer literacy. We launched TSR on 1 st April 2023. We have partnered with Prayer Fellowship, who has offered this space to us at no cost. It's fully set up with computers, software, stationery, wi -fi and the room is insured. To date, we have hosted Fire Fighting, First Aid, Nail-Tech, Maths Olympiad, Maths Kidz and the Computer Literacy Training

Sharing is Caring: This programme is a weekly donation sharing initiative. We are grateful for our regular donors. They enable us to share with our partners, volunteers, beneficiaries and families in need. These donations are also vital to our development and training programmes, ensuring that we can serve refreshments and meals to the trainees. We continue to build relationships collaborate and network, with our partners, donors and sponsors. Our volunteers are always afforded opportunities to empower and upskill themselves. And we always strive and work towards sustainability.
